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<b>DIAGNOSTIC Services – detection and diagnosis of diseases or conditions of the head and neck, includes check-up</b>		
<b>Exams</b>		
01101	\$71.17	Primary dentition – complete examination of a child with baby teeth only
01102	\$97.00	Mixed dentition – complete examination of a child with a mix of baby and adult teeth
01103	\$101.48	Permanent dentition – complete examination of an adult generally with only adult teeth
01202	\$64.19	Recall oral examination – examination of a previous patient adult or child
01204	\$64.24	Specific examination – examination of an issue in a localized area only
01205	\$64.24	Emergency examination – examination and investigation of pain or infection in a localized area only
<b>Periodontal – related to the gums, bone and other supporting structures of the teeth and mouth</b>		
01501	\$206.08	Periodontal examination – complete examination of the gums, bone and other and supporting tissues of teeth
<b>Periapical – type of x-ray that shows the entire tooth crown, root and surrounding bone of the teeth. Its uses include detecting changes in the bone and surrounding tissues, cysts, bone tumors, and abscesses</b>		
02111	\$27.60	Single periapical x-ray image
02112	\$47.50	Two periapical x-ray images
<b>Bitewing – type of x-ray that shows the crowns of several upper and lower teeth simultaneously. Its uses include cavity detection between teeth, evaluation of bone health and detecting calculus deposits</b>		
02142	\$45.08	Two bitewing x-ray images
02144	\$78.37	Four bitewing x-ray images)
<b>Panoramic – type of x-ray that shows many structures at once including the teeth, bone around the teeth, the temporomandibular joint (TMJ) and other structures of the face. <b>NOTE:</b> Additional x-rays may be required where fine detail is required such as is provided by periapical and bitewing radiographs.</b>

<b>PREVENTION Services – services targeted at preventing disease or its progression</b>		
<b>Polishing – removes stain and plaque. One unit of time is 15 minutes.</b>		
11101	\$59.84	One unit of time
11107	\$29.92	Half unit of time
<b>Scaling – removes calculus/tarter and hardened debris from the tooth surfaces above and below the gum line. One unit of time is 15 minutes.</b>

11117	\$33.58	Half unit of time
<b>Fluoride Treatment – a preventive service to reduce the risk of getting cavities</b>		
12112	\$28.99	Topical fluoride – services such as the application of a gel or foam fluoride treatment to reduce the risk of getting cavities
<b>Sealants – coatings generally applied to the chewing surfaces of back teeth to reduce the risk of cavity development as a preventive service</b>		
13401	\$32.63	Single tooth – coating to reduce the risk of cavity development
<b>RESTORATION Services – fillings or crowns that replaces lost tooth structure</b>		
<b>Primary Teeth – silver coloured filling for baby teeth</b>		

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21112	\$128.80	Two surfaces – silver coloured filling that includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Amalgam, Bonded, Permanent Molars</b> – silver coloured filling for adult teeth		
21242	\$181.71	Two surfaces – silver coloured bonded filling that includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Prefabricated, Metal, Primary Crown</b> – crown or cap for baby teeth frequently referred to as a stainless steel crown or cap		
22211	\$203.00	Primary posterior – metal crown for a baby back tooth
<b>Permanent Anteriors, Bonded Technique</b> – tooth coloured filling for adult front teeth		
23111	136.51	One surface – tooth coloured filling that includes 1 of the five tooth surfaces
23112	\$163.40	Two surfaces – tooth coloured filling that includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
23113	\$187.50	Three surfaces – tooth coloured filling that includes 3 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Permanent Bicuspid</b> s – tooth coloured fillings for adult bicuspid teeth. Bicuspid are also referred to as premolars		
23311	\$143.12	One surface – tooth coloured filling that includes 1 of the five tooth surfaces
23312	\$199.38	Two surfaces – tooth coloured filling that includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
23313	\$233.50	Three surfaces – tooth coloured filling that includes 3 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Permanent Molars</b> – tooth coloured fillings for adult molar teeth		
23321	\$149.60	One surface – tooth coloured fillings on adult molars includes 1 of the five tooth surfaces
23322	\$210.90	Two surfaces – tooth coloured fillings on adult molars includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
23323	\$249.69	Three surfaces – tooth coloured fillings on adult molars includes 3 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Tooth colored, Primary Posteriors</b> – tooth coloured filling on a baby back molar teeth		
23512	\$182.16	Two surfaces – tooth coloured fillings on a baby molar includes 2 of the five tooth surfaces
<b>Crown, Porcelain/Ceramic/Polymer Glass – uncomplicated</b> – A crown, also called a cap covering of a tooth with metal, porcelain or porcelain fused to metal. +L refers to laboratory charges that are in addition to the fee and vary case to case.		
27211	\$825.44	Fused to metal base +L – a crown or cap commonly referred to as porcelain fused to metal crown.
<b>ENDODONTICS – Root Canal Therapy</b> the treatment of a tooth having a damaged pulp/nerve.		
<b>Pulpotomy, Primary Teeth</b> – removal of the coronal portion of the pulp/nerve of a baby tooth so that the pulp/nerve of the root remains intact and viable		
32232	\$78.85	Concurrent with restoration – removal of the coronal portion of the pulp/nerve of a baby tooth (does not include the final restoration)
<b>Root Canals, Permanent – uncomplicated</b> – includes completely removing the pulp/nerve, sterilizing the pulp/nerve chamber and root canal spaces, and filling these spaces with sealing material.		
33111	\$662.15	One canal – root canal of a tooth with 1 canal
33121	\$964.25	Two canals – root canal of a tooth with 2 canals
33131	\$1,127.65	Three canals – root canal of a tooth with 3 canals
<b>PERIODONTICS – ORAL DISEASE</b> – diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of diseases and conditions of the supporting and surrounding tissues of the teeth		
<b>Root Planing</b> – the scraping of a bacteria-impregnated layer of cementum from the surface of a tooth root to prevent or treat periodontitis (gum disease). One unit of time is 15 minutes.

<b>PROSTHODONTICS – REMOVABLE</b> – dentures partial or complete that can be removed by the patient. +L refers to laboratory charges that are in addition to the fee and vary case to case. One unit of time is 15 minutes.		
<b>Standard</b> – uncomplicated complete denture		
51101	\$810.00	Maxillary +L – complete upper removable denture
51102	\$810.00	Mandibular +L – complete lower removable denture
53102	\$809.10	Mandibular +L – partial lower removable cast metal frame free end (no back teeth to support the denture)
<b>Adjustments, Partial or Complete Denture, Minor</b> – adjustment for any reason to a partial/complete denture		
54201	\$69.80	One unit of time +L
<b>Repair, Complete Denture, Impression Required</b>		
55201	\$141.06	Maxillary +L – upper denture repair impression required
<b>Reline, Processed, Complete Denture</b> – resurface the tissue side of a denture with new material to improve the fit		
56231	\$228.37	Maxillary +L – upper complete processed denture reline
<b>PROSTHODONTICS – FIXED</b> – cannot be removed by the patient, replaces one or more missing teeth and is attached to natural teeth and/or implants. +L refers to laboratory charges that are in addition to the fee and vary case to case.		
<b>Pontics, Porcelain/Ceramic/Polymer Glass</b> – artificial tooth portion of a bridge		
62501	\$438.90	Fused to metal +L – type of artificial tooth connected to other pontics or the bridge retainers
<b>Retainers, Porcelain/Ceramic/Polymer Glass, Fused To Metal Base</b> – cap or crown on the tooth or teeth that retains a bridge in the mouth		
67211	\$902.50	Fused to metal Base +L – type of bridge retainers that pontics attach to
<b>ORAL AND MAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY</b> – removal of teeth		
<b>Removals, Erupted Teeth, Uncomplicated</b> – extraction (pulling) an erupted tooth		
71101	\$134.33	Single tooth, uncomplicated – extraction (pulling) of 1 erupted tooth
<b>Removal, Erupted Teeth, Complicated</b> – extraction (pulling) of an erupted tooth requiring a surgical approach		
71201	\$242.25	Odontectomy, (extraction), erupted tooth, surgical approach, requiring surgical flap and/or sectioning of tooth
<b>ORTHODONTICS</b> – supervision, guidance and correction of the growing or mature dental and facial structures		
<b>Observations and Adjustments</b>		
80601	\$77.28	For tooth guidance – refers to items including observation of tooth position, eruption sequence, serial extraction supervision
<b>Appliances, Removable, Cross-Bite Correction</b> – condition in which the upper teeth bite inside the lower teeth. +L refers to laboratory charges that are in addition to the fee and vary case to case.		
81121	\$317.40	Maxillary, simple +L – upper appliance to correct a cross-bite
